NAVIANCE

Naviance is an important tool for students and parents. It helps students learn more about themselves in order to direct them in their college and career choices as well as assists tremendously in the college process. All students, freshmen through seniors, should already have log-in information to access Navi-

ance (https://

connection.naviance.com/fc/signin.php?hsid=monthsni). If you do not, please reach out to your counselor.

All freshmen will be asked to complete a "Learning Styles Inventory" to better understand how they learn as they transition into high school.

Sophomores will be asked to complete a "Do What You Are" survey that will highlight their career interests. We are also planning a Career Fair in December where students can explore a variety of career options connected to their interests.

Juniors and Seniors will be utilizing Naviance for their post-secondary planning (Seniors and senior parents please see page 2 under "Tips for Seniors"). It is also the site to find when colleges are visiting MHS and through which recommendation letters are processed.

Tips for College-bound Seniors:

- It is time to ask for letters of recommendation. Give it careful thought. The person should know you well and be able to highlight your strengths.
- This would be a great time for parents to complete the "Parents Point of View" in Naviance and for students to complete their "Student Brag Sheet!" This will assist counselors in the recommendation letter process.
- Narrow down your list of colleges. Take notes on each school of interest. Check Naviance for college visits to MHS.
- Know the deadlines for admission, financial aid, etc.. If you are applying early decision/action, some deadlines are as early as November 1.
- Research financial aid and scholarship opportunities.
- Begin your college application essays.

College Visits to MHS:

Every year there are at least 125 college admissions representatives who visit MHS to meet with students and answer their questions. To see a list of colleges and when they will be visiting, access Family Connection in Naviance. Students must register to attend.




Reminders:
