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Online Tools to Prevent Summer Regression

This summer our schools are providing free access for every student to two electronic resources that can help them to counteract summer regression: *Raz-Kids* and *Compass Learning Odyssey*.

Raz-Kids is a reading program that will differentiate reading instruction for your child by providing access to hundreds of animated leveled books. Students can listen to books for modeled fluency, read books with pronunciation and vocabulary support and record their own reading. They are able to complete interactive quizzes at the end of the book to check for understanding. Your child should have received his or her login and password already. If not, please check with your child's teacher.



Odyssey is another web-based resource available to help students review content and practice skills in Math, Science, Social Studies and Language Arts. Student logins have already been provided, and Village School students have been using it both at school and at home. Data from our June MAP assessments will be used to create newly differentiated learning paths in *Odyssey* for all VES learners.

Summer Skills Sharpener Books

Sometimes parents ask us for recommendations for additional print resources that can support or extend the topics learned in school. In response to this request, we are providing you information regarding the Summer Skills series by Tri-C Publications. This print based program is not provided by the school district, but can be purchased by families who would like their children to maintain or extend their skills over the summer months.

The *Summer Skills Sharpener* books...

support topics in Montgomery's curriculum

provide a refresher of basic skills already taught during the preceding year. (A student usually works in the book for the grade level most recently completed. Some children benefit from books at higher or lower grade levels. Speak with your child's teacher if you are unsure as to whether or not your child is working on, above or slightly below grade level so that you can order the book(s) appropriate to his or her level.)

contain a series of varied and interesting tasks on each page

provide enough pages so students can refresh their skills three times per week for ten weeks

contain an answer key and/or solutions for each task. "Tutorial Help" pages are also included.

are organized by one grade level per book for K-8 Language Arts and in the same way for K-8

Mathematics. In addition, there are subject specific books for Pre-Algebra, Algebra, Geometry, Spanish I and II, French I, Keyboarding, and High School Review.

use a mixed skill format in the single subject books that pinpoint the areas of difficulty and reinforce the most important concepts over the summer months

VES and OHES Introduce *Math in Focus: Singapore Math*

Dear Orchard Hill and Village Families,

I am pleased to announce that our schools will adopt and begin implementation of *Math in Focus: Singapore Math*, a new elementary math program, in Grades K-4 during the 2013-2014 school year.

Beginning with a major curriculum revision between 2010 and 2012, we have been working hard to align our curriculum to the Common Core Standards and to improve on our already high performing math program. In the spring of 2012, a process began to select new K-4 mathematics materials that would help teachers to implement this new curriculum with consistency. The process included a review of available textbook programs, polling of surrounding high performing districts, the development and implementation of a Kepner-Tregoe Decision Analysis Protocol, a pilot of the materials with a wide variety of students in nineteen K-4 classrooms, faculty meetings and professional development opportunities throughout the year, and the collection of feedback from teachers, students and parents. On May 28th, the Board of Education approved our recommendation to adopt *Math in Focus: Singapore Math* as the resource to anchor our K-4 mathematics program.

In researching the programs great care, thought, time and attention was devoted to several considerations, including faculty, student and community feedback, the Common Core State Standards, the upcoming PARCC assessments, the alignment of programs with Lower Middle School, feedback from other districts using the various programs, and most importantly, our goal to provide excellent math instruction that balances depth of understanding, procedural skill and fluency, and application.

We are confident about our decision because it is an excellent match to the things we value most as a K-4 community: rich mathematical experiences, consistently high levels of instruction using the best materials, tools for clear and frequent communication, the meaningful use of technology, and most importantly- the focus on growth for all students no matter their starting point. With an abundance of resources to support the instruction in the classroom and at home, Math in Focus will help teachers to meet the needs of all learners. As a school team we are fully committed to its successful implementation.

Please look for an upcoming family night in the fall to introduce you to *Math in Focus* and to continue our conversation about how we can work together to best support your children's mathematics education. Currently you can find powerpoint presentations and resource materials posted on our school websites. Additional materials will begin to be posted on the school websites over the summer. General 2012-2013 Supply List For Rising 3rd Graders

Dear Incoming Third Grade Students and Families,

In an effort to make your supply shopping easier, the third grade team has come up with a list of supplies that you can begin to look for. We have chosen these items carefully and feel that they enhance our instructional program. **Toward the end of the summer, you will receive information regarding additional items specific to your classroom.**

- 12 sharpened pencils
- 1 set of crayons OR colored pencils (keep to no more than 24 colors)
- 2 rolls of scotch tape in individual plastic dispensers
- 4 dry erase markers
- 1 pencil box (standard plastic rectangular one)
- 1 highlighter
- 4 Post-It note pads
- 4 composition notebooks
- 1 one-subject spiral notebook
- 2 glue sticks
- Headphones in a Ziplock bag with your name on it – for your personal use

5th Grade Teachers

All incoming 5th grade students will need to purchase the following supplies.

They will be necessary for their core classes and cycle/elective classes.

Bring to school on the first day:

- Soft pencil case
- Box of pencils
- 2 different color pens (one red and another color)
- 3 different color highlighters
- Erasers
- Hand-held pencil sharpener
- Colored pencils
- 6 *refill* rolls of ¾" tape (dispenser is not needed)
- 1 box of tissues
- Scissors
- 3 pads of Post-Its (3" x 3" minimum)
- Dry erase marker (Expo for individual use)
- White board eraser (a clean sock works just as well)
- Safety goggles in a Zip-loc bag (Be sure that you bring goggles as opposed to safety glasses. Do not bring ski goggles, swimming goggles, or goggles with tinted lenses. Goggles should feel comfortable to wear.)



Cycle/Elective Class Supplies:

- New, unwashed, white, cotton tee shirt (for Industrial Technology)
- #2 Drawing Pencil (for Art)
- 2" binder and five divider pages (for Spanish/Communications)
- 4 x 6 index cards (for Communications)
- 3 x 5 index cards (for Spanish)
- Loose-leaf paper (for Spanish/Communications)
- White poster board (22 in. X 28 in. minimum) (for Communications)
- Box of Pencils (for Reading Support)
- 1 subject notebook (for Chorus)
- 1 folder (for Chorus)

- Liquid White Out
- Rolling backpacks
- Gel pens
- Permanent markers

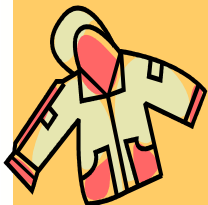
