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Guidance Offerings from Mrs. Fornal and Mrs. Schantz

Village School is excited to welcome an addition to our counseling staff. Mrs. Jolene Schantz will serve as our full-time 3rd grade guidance counselor. Mrs. Schantz has served as an academic support teacher for several years in the Franklin Township School District and recently earned a master's degree in counseling from Rider University. She will be a wonderful addition to our district's counseling program and will be working closely with fourth grade counselor, Mrs. Fornal and our entire team. Please join us in welcoming her to our team.

Our counselors offer individual and small group counseling to students who would benefit from additional support. Parents and teachers may refer students when they feel a child needs a safe place to go to express their thoughts, feelings, and concerns. The first group of the year, the Newcomers Club, will be held during the first few weeks of school to assist new students with their transition to our district. Students will converse with peers, ask questions about the school, and participate in activities.

Other groups offered throughout the year include Social Skills, Controlling Emotions, Self-Esteem, Separation/Divorce, Loss, How Your Engine Runs, Organization, Relaxation, and Siblings of Special Needs. These groups will begin in late September or early October. Parents are encouraged to contact the counselors for more information. Mrs. Fornal will be the fourth grade counselor and can be reached at Ifornal@mtsd.us. Mrs. Schantz will be the third grade counselor and can be reached at jschantz@mtsd.us. You may also call 609-466-7606 and press 5 for the guidance office. The counselors will be sharing room 301 this year.

As the year progresses, our counselors will provide monthly guidance lessons following the Steps to Respect Anti-Bullying Program emphasizing the pillars of character. The pillars include: Trustworthiness, Respect, Responsibility, Fairness, Caring, Citizenship, Sportsmanship, Friendship, Honesty, and Leadership. They will also work closely with teachers, administrators, and other faculty to monitor the academic, social, and emotional needs of students to determine the appropriate interventions that can help students reach their full potential.



The History of Blazer, Our Bluebird

Bluebirds thrive in areas of open farmlands where insects and old woodpecker holes exist. Montgomery offers this type of habitat, especially in the land around Village School, and can be enhanced with the addition of bluebird houses.

Cousins of the robin, Bluebirds have made a comeback through the efforts of people who provide and maintain nesting boxes along bluebird "trails." Several bluebird boxes were installed on VES grounds a few years ago. As a result, bluebirds have become commonplace around VES and in many parts of Montgomery. Students can learn about and observe these quiet, beautiful birds right here on our school grounds while practicing caring and responsibility for our fellow inhabitants.

In April 2006, Village Students voted to name our mascot Blazer the Bluebird and in 2007 they voted for our school motto: Blazer says, "Be Your Best at VES!"

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IMPORTANT SCHOOL DAY PROCEDURES—PLEASE REVIEW

ARRIVAL, DISMISSAL, VISITING AND PARKING

- **School Hours:** 9:30 3:50
- Early Dismissal Hours: 9:30-1:30 (Parent pick up begins at 1:15)
- Emergency Delayed Opening: 11:30-3:50 (Student drop off 11:20-11:30)
- **Transportation:** Buses will drop students off and pick them up at the main entrance to VES. Your child's transportation arrangements are available on *Genesis* accessible from the district home page. Delays during the first days of school are normal.
- Before School Drop Off: If you need to drive your child to school, you must travel on Spruce Drive and use the rear entrance of the school. This entrance will be open from 9:20 a.m. - 9:30 a.m. Please do not drop your child off early as the doors will be locked until 9:20. When dropping children off at the rear entrance in the morning, if you stop your vehicle next to the school sidewalk, your child may exit on his or her own on that side of your vehicle. However, if your child has to walk across lanes of traffic, you must walk him or her to the sidewalk. Please do not drop students off in the front of Village School at any time, except for before school programs. After 9:30 a.m., park in our front visitors' lot and an adult must sign children in at the main office.
- After School Pickup: If you need to pick your child up at the end of the school day, park in the large back lot and enter through the cafeteria doors or park on the right side of the back driveway that is between the school and the traffic island. Enter through the main rear entrance doors. Please do not park on the roadway itself as it creates a traffic hazard. Students will be dismissed to the cafeteria for parent pick-up at 3:45 p.m. as instruction takes place up until this time. Parents must sign children out in the cafeteria. Please send a note to your child's teacher in the morning if you plan on picking up your child in the afternoon or if your child is attending an after

- school activity. Without a note, children will be sent to their buses. Midday and end of day pickup requests can be disruptive to instruction and are difficult to honor as dismissal information is confirmed early in the day.
- between 9:30 and 3:45 must provide photo identification. After you push the button to buzz in, you must give your name and scheduled appointment destination, enter through the front entrance, report to the main office, show identification, sign in and obtain a visitor nametag. During special events, the Spruce Drive/rear entrance hours may be extended. These times will be communicated in advance. Visitors must sign out in the office before leaving the premises.
- Late or Midday Drop off/Pickup: If you need to drop off or pickup your child between the hours of 9:30 and 3:45, please park in our visitors' parking lot in the front of VES and use the main front entrance. Parking is not permitted in the front driveway as it is a bus driveway only. After 9:30 a.m., children must be signed in by an adult. You must submit a request in writing in advance if a late arrival or early pick up is planned. (BOE Policy 5230) Please sign your child in or out at the main office.
- School Day Parking: Parents/visitors may park in our front visitors' lot, our side lot, or our large lot in the back between 9:30 and 3:45. When parking in the back lot, all visitors will need to walk around VES and enter the front main entrance. Please do not park on or block roadways. If you absolutely must park on a roadway, use caution and park on the far right side. Parking is always prohibited in designated fire zones and in the bus driveway. Please use caution when parking along the side of the road and driveways. Always park off the road to the right as far as possible and do not block roadways.



Dear Parents and Guardians,

Welcome Back! I hope everyone had a great summer. I invite you to review September's lunch menu online at www.mtsd.k12.nj.us. Simply select your child's school from the main page and click on "Lunch Menu" to access the menu each month. Nutrislice is a new addition to our menu options. Click on the Nutrislice link under the lunch menus and you can see important information about the products being served daily. Nutrislice will list all allergy information, ingredients, carbohydrate counts etc. Please check our menu/Nutrislice for each days hot and cold lunch selection.

Please ensure that your child has the necessary funds in his/her account. You can still send in cash or a check (made payable to Montgomery Township Board of Education or MTBOE food services) or use our online payment system www.payforit.net. When your child's account has three lunches remaining the cashiers will give your child a friendly reminder. Mrs. Lanzner, my Assistant Director, will contact you by phone or email in order to remind you to make a deposit to your child's account. Children's accounts do go negative from time to time but any lunch purchased will be charged to the students account for collection. Lunch at the elementary schools will be \$2.30 and milk sold separately is \$0.60.

Your child may choose one item from the main menu, i.e. hamburger, salad or a premade deli sandwich. Children may choose a hot or cold vegetable, fresh or cupped fruit, and 1% white, fat free, or chocolate milk. A complete lunch comes with five components, meat/meat alternate, grain, vegetable, fruit and milk. If a child doesn't take 4 of the 5 components, the lunch will be sold at ala carte prices. We encourage children to take the fruit and vegetables.

Our pizza on Fridays is made with a whole wheat crust, and our chicken nuggets and patties are all white meat with a whole grain breading. More information can be found on Nutrislice. We will be selling baked chips, low fat ice cream, reduced fat cookies, fruit and veggie cups for snacks as time permits during the week. Snacks range in price from \$0.50 to \$1.00. Water is not part of a lunch and is offered as an ala carte item for \$1.00. The USDA set this rule stating that water has no nutritional value.

Allergies are listed in RED on each register for the cashier to see. The list is updated each year by the school nurses and I keep a hard copy in my office. If you have any other questions or concerns, please contact me at Chartwells@mtsd.us or 609-466-7602 ext. 6510.

- * Games/Electronic Devices/Cell Phones: Due to the risk of loss, damage, and disruption to the learning environment, the use of these items during the school day is strongly discouraged. Students are encouraged to engage in social interactions with their peers during lunch, recess, and on the bus ride to and from school. If games and electronics are brought to school, students will be required to keep them off and in backpacks during instructional time. Cell phones may not be used during school hours.
