Welcome to our AP Statistics family!

AP Statistics is a very useful subject for college and many fields of career. Ask questions, be prepared and try your hardest. Let's make this the best math year ever!

This course introduces students to the major concepts and tools for collecting, analyzing, and drawing conclusions from data. Students will be expected to understand concepts taught in class, and also to evaluate, synthesize and apply them to new applications and problem solving situations as preparation for the AP exam.

I. *Determining the Final Grade (based on MHS policy):*



1st Semester (September to January)	44%
2 nd Semester (February to June)	44%
Final Exam	12%

Seniors with a year average of 90+ will be exempted from the Final Exam.

II. *Determining the Semester Grade (based on MHS policy)*

Tests, Quizzes, Mock AP Test and EOY Project	90%
Homework and Participation:	10%



Based on MHS math department policies:

There's **no individual extra credit / retesting**.

For assessments that are weighted at 10% or greater, remediation designed by the teacher can increase the posted grade to a 50%.

III. *Classroom Rules:*

- Pay attention:
Everything becomes so much easier when you pay attention.
- BYOD policy:
You will be informed when it's OK to use personal devices for learning purpose.
Pay attention, so you don't get confused and waste time. Put phones away.
- Absent on a quiz or test day
You must **email me within 24 hours** to arrange a time to make up the assessment.
Failing to show up to a pre-arranged time or not communicating with me may result in a 10% late penalty or you will get a different test with a different format.
- Bathroom use:

- You must pay attention and do homework to be successful in this class.
- Post homework in Google Classroom **before** the next class for full credits.

- Review packets will be collected on test day. You don't need to post on GC.
- Late Homework is NOT accepted.

You will start with 5 participation points.

You may lose participation points for behaviors that interrupt student learning.
